Paul stayed in Corinth for some time after that, then said good-bye to the brothers and sisters and went to nearby Cenchrea...Then he set sail for Syria, taking Priscilla and Aquila with him. 19 They stopped first at the port of Ephesus... Acts 18:24-26 (NLT)



Meanwhile, a Jew named Apollos, an eloquent speaker who knew the Scriptures well, had arrived in Ephesus from Alexandria in Egypt. 25 He had been taught the way of the Lord, and he taught others about Jesus with an enthusiastic spirit and with accuracy. 18.7/-26 (NIIT)




